The scope of internship programme was rated by 53% of the practice teaching school heads as excellent, 47% of school heads rated as very good and none of the heads have rated as good and satisfactory.

Regarding twin internship programme offered in the curriculum 40% of school heads rated as excellent and very good each and only 20% of heads rated as good. None of the school heads rated the twin internship as satisfactory.

33% of the heads of practice teaching schools rated the proficiency of student teachers at the time of internship programme as excellent followed by 40% as very good and 27% of heads rated as good. None has rated as satisfactory

Practical components offered in the curriculum is rated by 27% of practice teaching school heads as excellent, 40% of school heads rated the practical components as very good and 33% as good and none has rated as satisfactory.

Effectiveness of curriculum to develop innovative thinking is rated by 27% of school heads as excellent and 53% of heads rated as very good and 20% as good. None of the heads have rated as satisfactory.


On the curriculum parameter regarding content matching to the pedagogy, 40% of school heads rated as excellent, 33% rated as very good and 27% of the heads rated as good.

















Feed back on curriculum by faculty was collected based on four point rating: Excellent, Very good, Good and Satisfactory. The rating of the curriculum parameters are as follows.

Relevance of the course content to the present teacher education scenario is rated as excellent by 67% of the faculty followed by 33% of faculty as very good. None of the faculty rated as good and satisfactory.

Allocation of credits for each course is rated by 33% of faculty as excellent, 56% of faculty rated as very good and 11% rated as good.

Regarding the curriculum in relation to the current professional standard, 33% of faculty rated as excellent and 67% rated as very good and none of the faculty rated as good and satisfactory.

Academic flexibility of the curriculum is rated by 33% of faculty as excellent, 56% as very good and 11% of faculty rated as good.

Regarding allocation of time for covering syllabus, 22% of faculty rated as excellent. But 44% of faculty rated as very good and 34% rated as good, but none has rated as satisfactory on the time allocation for covering the syllabus.

More over 11% of faculty rated as excellent and 67% rated as very good and 22% of faculty rated as good on the adequateness of reference material prescribed in the courses. But none of the faculty members rated as satisfactory.

Suitability of the curriculum to the professional requirements is rated as excellent by 44% of faculty members and 56% of faculty rated as very good. None of the faculty rated as good and satisfactory.

Course content is enriched with advanced topics is rated as excellent by 33% of faculty, and 67% rated the course content as very good. But none of the faculty rated as satisfactory.

Regarding the need base of the curriculum, 44% of faculty rated as excellent and 44% of faculty as very good and 12% rated as good. None of the faculty rated as satisfactory.

Depth of the subject matter for attaining the learning outcomes is rated as excellent by 44% of faculty and remaining 56% of faculty rated as very good.
